IN MEMORIAM.

W. F. BALL.

Mr. W. F. Ball, who died at the age of 76, became a member of the Association in 1930, and although he did not take part in the climbing activities of the Association he attended a number of the winter lectures. His quiet charm of manner and kindness earned the respect of those who knew him.

In his younger days he was one of the best known and most successful racing and touring cyclists, and his keen interest in cycling remained to the end. He was a Past President of the Fellowship of Old-Time Cyclists, whose membership is confined to those who have ridden high bicycles, and he contributed the weekly cycling notes to the *Birmingham Mail* for over thirty years.
